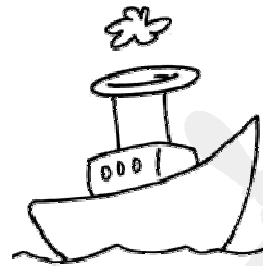

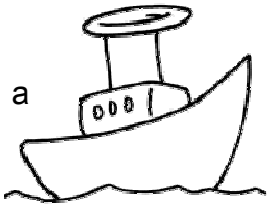

Leon County Project Lifesaver

The Pilot Club of Tallahassee, Leon County Sheriff's Office, and Alzheimer's Project of Tallahassee, Inc. are pleased to announce the kick-off of Leon County Project Lifesaver.



Project Lifesaver relies on proven radio technology and a specially trained search and rescue team. Clients that are enrolled in the Project Lifesaver program wear a personalized wristband that emits a tracking signal. When caregivers notify the local Project Lifesaver agency that the person is missing, a search and rescue team responds to the wanderer's area and starts searching with the mobile locator tracking system. Search times have been reduced from hours and days to minutes. In over 1000 searches, there have been no reported serious injuries or deaths. Recovery times average less than 30 minutes.

The Project Lifesaver bracelet is much more than a passive ID bracelet. It is a one-ounce battery-operated radio wrist transmitter emitting an automatic tracking signal every second, 24 hours a day. The signal is tracked on the ground or in the air over several miles. As each bracelet has a unique radio frequency, the Project Lifesaver search team positively locates and identifies the person who has wandered away from home or a care facility.



Leon County Project Lifesaver is open to persons with Alzheimer's disease or related dementia disorders and children with Down's syndrome and autism. There is no cost to be a participant in the program.

If it were not for the insight and generosity of the Pilot Club of Tallahassee, this program would not be available. Pilots be proud! You are making a real difference in the lives of many people.

Recipe of the Month

Lemon-Spiced Chicken Sandwiches

Chicken:

- 6 ea chicken breasts
- 4 clv garlic – minced
- 3 ea lemon – zested
- 2 T fresh parsley – chopped
- olive oil -- for sautéing

Basil Aioli

- ½ cup low-fat mayonnaise
- 1 clv garlic – pressed
- ½ cup fresh basil -- chopped

6 rolls

To prepare chicken:

Heat grill or sauté pan.

Mix the garlic, parsley and lemon zest together in a small bowl. Brush chicken with oil. Rub mixture onto both sides of chicken.

Cook chicken on both sides until done - about 8 to 10 minutes.

To prepare aioli:

In a separate small bowl, stir together mayonnaise, basil and garlic.

To make sandwiches:

Spread a small amount of the aioli on both the top and bottom of the sandwich bread.

Lay chicken on the bottom half of the sandwich and top with your favorite sandwich accoutrements - lettuce, onion, tomato, etc.

Serve with kettle-cooked potato

chips.
