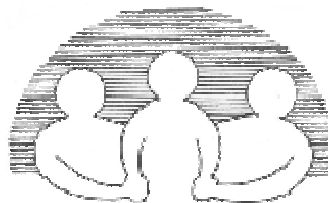

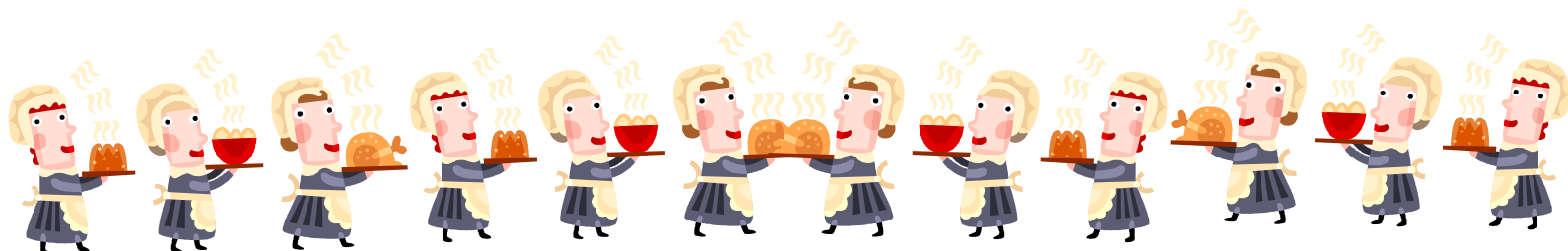

minutes – october 16

Attendance

The meeting was called to order at 6:12 p.m. by Yvonne Hale, President. Yvonne introduced the Official Visitor, Virginia Bunde, Northwest Lieutenant Governor and Grace Hall, a guest of Yvonne's. Yvonne pointed out the new format of the Deck Chatter, created by Pam Manley. Bea Mizell will check on having our logo camera ready for use on items such as t-shirts.

Cares and Concerns

Invocation was given by Vicki Muse-Johnson ("The Sheltering Tree of Friendship") and Valencia Salters-Jenkins led the Pledge of Allegiance. Roll call was taken by Claire Mikko.

Virginia Bunde was introduced and spoke to the club. This is a synopsis of her speech: Greetings from the District, Florida District Governor, DEC, and PI. She had previously reviewed our yearbook and work plans and stated we are doing a good job on our projects. A club does well when credit on projects is shared by the whole club instead of individuals of a club. Pilot is volunteer work in an organization we believe in. Our club works on BrainMinders and supports the Scholarship House, PI programs, Project Lifesaver and has received grants. For more members, try to bring guests to the meetings and send out letters to recruit. She spoke about Fall Council and International Convention in Atlanta. Discussed the Leadership Training by Brian Biro who talked about looking beyond the stumbling blocks to reach a goal. Place a positive spin on fundraisers rather than why not. We can only get better.

Minutes

Claire Mikko asked members to read the minutes. Two changes were made to the minutes: change the words "Budget format" in the third paragraph in **Treasurer's Report** to "Treasurer's report" and

change "Carol" to "Karol" in the second paragraph of **Fundraising**. A motion to accept the minutes was made by Linda Summerlin and seconded by Lucretia Thomas. Motion to accept the minutes, with changes, was carried.

Treasurer's Report

LaTanya White reminded members that October starts second quarter of the Pilot year and local dues are due. The \$53 dues should be paid no later than the end of December. She gave an explanation of the treasurer's report.

President-Elect Report

Bea said she had Yearbooks with her if anyone had not received on yet.

Club Operations

Bea and Linda talked about Secret Pal. Members need to take an active step in finding out more about the person they have as their Secret Pal. Yvonne said the "Bios" might help because they list hobbies. Linda stated we might have to keep the names we have for more than one year because some names still have not been selected. The remaining names may have to be mailed to the members who have not selected a name yet. Bea mentioned that she had hoped the Pilot Socials would help bring our club closer together but not too many members are taking part in the socials.

Fundraising

Valencia represented the committee. Linda Summerlin will look for the raffle tickets and Bea may be able to provide some. Bea will take the basket to the Fall Council.

Projects and Youth

Claire asked Vicki Muse-Johnson to speak about the Second Harvest food drive. Vicki asked members to bring canned goods or money to the November 20 meeting. Vicki and Lucretia will shop with the money and bring the items to the Second Harvest Food Bank.

Claire read the e-mail on Leon High School Anchor Club from Laura Patrick, PI Anchor Liaison. At this time, PI is trying to work something out with the school to retain their Anchor Charter. If the

delinquent dues situation isn't solved, it will result in Leon Anchors having their Charter pulled. A discussion ensued about helping the club with their dues, if they are willing to help out. Jane Furlong will write a letter to Mr. Rocky Hanna, Principal, about Anchor Club, her being a Charter member of the Leon Anchors, and that there has been an Anchor Club at Leon High since 1955, along with the benefits of being an Anchor.

Our club is going to contact Amos P. Godby High School (Valencia), James Rickards High School (Annarene) and Florida High (Claire) about their interest in starting an Anchor Club. When Valencia asked who the point of contact would be about starting an Anchor Club, it was agreed upon it would be the Principal.

Claire spoke with Mr. Finlayson, Aucilla Christian Academy Principal. He informed us that the students voted on which club they were going to combine to – Key Club or Anchor Club. The students voted for Key Club. Claire asked Susan Williams, Florida District Anchor Liaison, the next step. Susan asked for a letter from Aucilla Anchors surrendering their Charter.

Update on Project Lifesaver and Poker Run

Linda Summerlin thanked everyone who helped make the Project a success. This year \$18,000 was raised. Maclay Anchors and Scholarship

House residents helped out this year. Claire asked if Cathy Jones was going to write a follow-up article for the newspaper – Linda will check with Cathy. Linda stated they realize more publicity is needed and if anyone has any ideas to please let her know.

Old Business

Yvonne reminded everyone about Fall Council and the Silent Auction, if anyone had anything to donate.

New Business

Yvonne read the PI letter about the International Heritage Center and handed out the request for donations paperwork. The Scholarship House Thanksgiving dinner is Sunday, November 5th. Yvonne will check on the time and let us know. The Scholarship House luncheon will be in January. Linda asked about inviting the members of the Southern Scholarship Board to the luncheon. Valencia stated the Scholarship House will have a Mary Kay Party and Taboo Social on October 21 and all are invited. Yvonne spoke about the WFSU fundraiser and asked us to keep it in mind for the future. Claire read the letter from PI Foundation that included a Certificate of Appreciation and PI Foundation Emerald Club patch for us reaching the Emerald level of donations (\$5,000 to \$9,999).

The meeting adjourned at 7:12 p.m.
