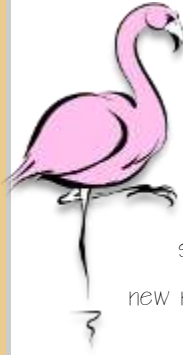

Meet Judy Taylor

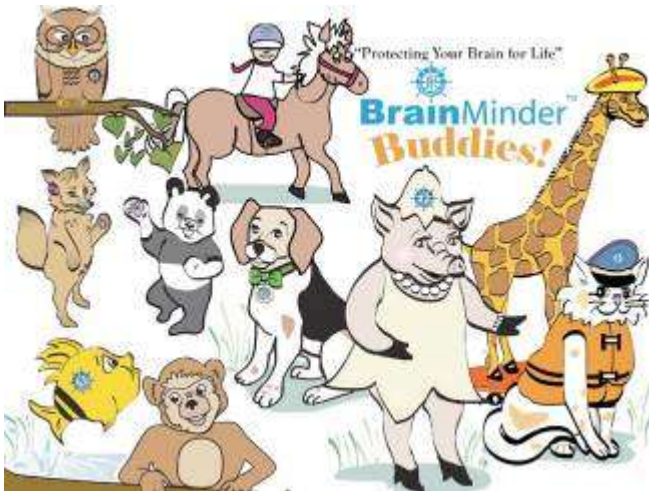
