Pilot Scholarship House Foundation



Each Pilot Scholarship House is home to 16 to 23 students and is supervised by a house manager who is an upperclassman. The students elect officers each semester to run the houses. In this cooperative living arrangement, residents take turns planning meals, shopping, cooking and cleaning up after the nightly group dinners.

This rent-free housing saves each student approximately \$13,000 each year. The budgeted cost of food and utilities is shared among the residents, with an average house services bill per student of approximately \$950 per semester.

PSHF assists 77 students toward their goal of a college education annually.
